Heath Hands is the conservation and community charity for Hampstead Heath.

We help conserve 350 hectares of unique green space in North London, delivering projects and activities across Hampstead Heath, Highgate Wood, Keats House and the Kenwood Estate. We are involved with a wide variety of volunteering, community outreach, wildlife conservation, learning, and nature related programmes.

Heath Hands works with and supports people and groups of all backgrounds, ages and abilities. We strive to give everyone an opportunity to get involved in activities on green spaces.

We coordinate a wide range of volunteer programmes including practical conservation and habitat management, ecological surveys, interpretation and events. Our experienced staff team works proactively to deliver these programmes and oversees our fundraising and community outreach projects. We are an active and growing organisation with a broad range of activities including schools and youth volunteering, community outreach, health connections and public events programmes.

Founded in 1999, Heath Hands is a collaborative organisation working in partnership with the City of London Corporation and English Heritage, who manage our green spaces, alongside numerous local groups and charities helping to deliver our programmes and aims.

Aim 1: Conservation

Heath Hands help conserve 350 hectares of amazing green space, helping maintain a rich mosaic of important habitats, conserving wildlife and preserving the unique character of this unique landscape.

We deliver a range of conservation programmes and environmental projects across Hampstead Heath, Highgate Wood and the Kenwood Estate. Our volunteers make an amazing contribution to the conservation of our green spaces, and we work to engage visitors and get the local community involved in nature conservation.

- Actively contribute to the conservation and maintenance of the historic landscapes and gardens in collaboration with our partner organisations
- Deliver a varied and accessible conservation programme involving volunteers of all backgrounds and abilities
- Work with our local community and partners to enhance nature and improve connectivity around the borders of our green spaces
- Deliver nature interpretation, ecological monitoring and citizen science projects to enhance the public's understanding and support for the conservation of our green spaces
- Develop our conservation and maintenance programmes in relation to environmental need, and in coordination with our partner organisations









Aim 2: Community

Heath Hands works to give everyone from the community, regardless of background or ability, a chance to get involved in volunteering and recreation on our green spaces.

We deliver a range of free events, nature days and activities for people and groups of all backgrounds and abilities throughout the year.

- Work to give everyone the chance to get involved in volunteering and recreation on Hampstead Heath, Kenwood Estate, Highgate Wood and Keats House
- Collaborate with our partner organisations and build strong links with a wide range of groups from the local community to promote the enjoyment and appreciation of our green spaces
- Deliver an engaging programme of activities and events for our volunteers, members and the general public
- Encourage a greater range of people getting involved with our programmes with particular focus on youth, people living with a disability and people underrepresented in the environmental sector









Aim 3: Learning

Heath Hands works to engage and connect people with nature across our green spaces through a wide-ranging programme of learning activities and events.

We develop educational resources and sessions to inspire and educate people of all ages and abilities, actively working to enhance learning opportunities.

- Work to increase general understanding and appreciation of our green spaces and the natural environment by providing volunteering and learning opportunities for people of all ages and abilities
- Deliver nature interpretation and public outreach activities and develop educational resources to help people learn about our nature conservation and wildlife
- Develop our Heath Friendly Schools and university programmes and work with the local community to encourage participation and enjoyment through our various youth projects
- Provide work experience and training opportunities, particularly for people under-represented in the environmental sector, offering pathways to employment









Aim 4: Wellbeing

Heath Hands actively aims to provide opportunities to improve the physical and mental wellbeing of all participants in our activities.

We believe that spending meaningful time in nature is hugely beneficial for physical and mental wellbeing. Getting active outdoors and taking part in group activities makes a positive contribution and benefits wellbeing.

- Promote physical and mental wellbeing through positive engagement with, and enjoyment of our green spaces
- Develop our wellbeing and volunteering activities to enhance the health and wellbeing of our volunteers and the general public, focusing particularly on those people with poor physical and mental health
- Partner with organisations to offer therapeutic nature-based activities, opportunities for social prescribing and enhanced health and wellbeing outcomes
- Offer support health connection links to help ensure our programmes and green spaces are inclusive and welcoming to people of all abilities and backgrounds
